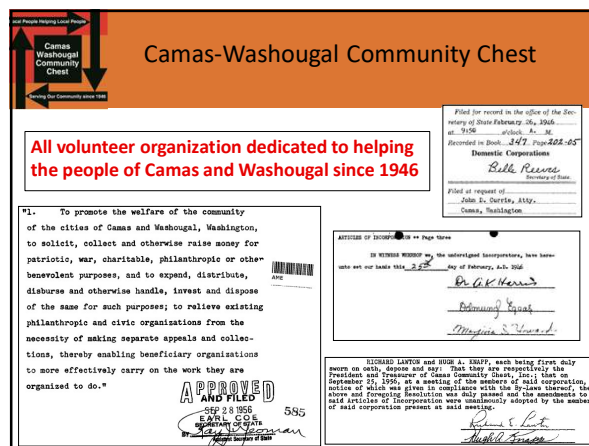

Inter-faith Treasure House



- In 2018, 3,910 meals served at Lost and Found Café

- In 2019, CWCC \$5,000 Challenge Grant helped IFTH buy new large delivery van for weekend food backpack program for CSD schoolchildren

Children's Home Society of WA at East County Family Resource Center

- 2,500 persons helped in 2018
- Grant helps fund salary for full-time staff, Laura Williams
- Center focuses on building skills in families, leaving them better prepared to function independently
- Child and family counseling sessions
- Weekend backpack program for Washougal schoolchildren

New Grant Recipient – Teen Reach Adventure Camp Camas

- 27 youth in foster care attended a 3-day summer camp staffed by 62 volunteers (40 volunteers were from Camas or Washougal)
- CWCC grant helped pay for equipment, t-shirts, supplies
- From a foster parent: "You and your staff did a wonderful job. The kids had a great time and everything was perfect. I was wowed at everything they did and the beautiful pictures they got to bring home. My niece said 'I can't believe how many people really love me' - this says a lot and she really needed this. Executive Summary 2019 Grants

- In 2019, the C-W Community Chest gave out **\$108,500** in grants to **29 agencies**, providing over **18,000 individual services** for people in Camas and Washougal. That's an increase of around 50% from our 2015 and 2016 totals!
- This is pretty astonishing, given that not so long ago, our major donors – **Camas paper mill** employees – were subject to layoffs and our future looked uncertain.
- Because the C-W Community Chest has no paid employees and very low expenses, and we have pledged to give back every dollar donated, we were able to fully fund many longtime grant recipients and help out a few new ones.
- In recent years, over **97% of all donations** have gone directly back into the community. (The remaining 3% largely covers insurance and printing fees.)
